

leaf. Your leaf is also more likely to have a scalloped edge and deeper quilting on the surface.


So where did that unusual name originate? The original hybrid was named 'Clackamas Rattler' by Oppen Nurseries in Clackamas, Oregon, probably in the 1950's. It is believed that the cultivar was fancifully named after the train which regularly rattled through the town at night. The name stuck, although some others have more recently chosen to describe the trait as 'watermelon' foliage instead. A keyword search on the AVSA website reveals several articles printed through the years in the *African Violet Magazine*, the longest being on page 25 of the September 1969 issue. If you are interested, you may order back issues from the AVSA store.

Do you know what "Clackamas" means when we talk about African violets? Look closely at this photo of 'Maas' Angela.' See anything unusual? It's lovely and it is an African violet. But those leaves are not your typical African violet leaves! This is clackamas foliage. It is among the rarest of all the flower and leaf traits seen in African violets.

Take a closer look at the front and backside of another clackamas variety which has where you can see the long veins on the backside. Compare the leaves from one of your own violets. You are likely to see shorter veins branching from the center line almost all the way up to the tip of the
