Linda Lloyd's "Red Lion" Makes a Comeback



In 2015, Linda Lloyd in Ohio, won Best in Show with "Red Lion" at the joint Cincinnati AVS & AVS of Dayton Show. It was a glorious plant as you can see here. Two years later it needed work.

Linda is a serious grower. "I have 5 light stands with T8 lights upstairs and one downstairs that I use for plants that like it cooler or for isolating plants brought back from a show. All of my adult plants are wick watered on individual reservoirs and my lights are usually on for about 8 hours a day."

She received a start of "Red Lion" (a vintage hybrid developed by Marie Burns and registered in 1989) from a friend about six years ago. "After it's win in 2015, I'm sure that it was repotted once or twice but not on a show schedule at that time. I had taken some leaves off it and planned on repotting it soon but didn't. Our club was having a game at our meeting and everyone was supposed to take different size and type of leaves, so I took a few more leaves off "Red Lion" for that. A week or two later our club had a table at a craft fair. We demonstrated how to put down an African Violet leaf to anyone we could stop, and then gave them the potted leaf with information about our club and how to care for their new baby. Lots more Red Lion leaves went to that craft fair! By now I had a mini palm tree."

It was time for Linda to do some serious repotting. "Right after taking this picture I beheaded the poor thing." "I am pretty brutal with my plants. I left about 5 leaves at the top and used a sturdy pair of scissors to cut the stem off above the soil level. For me that makes it easier to work with. I can then lay the stem on my potting table and use a knife to cut the stem about one inch below the bottom leaves. I stuck it into a small pot filled with damp potting mix and watered it in. I usually don't dome or bag plants when I do this, just sit them in a tray with other babies or restarts and watch them closely for the first few days so they don't dry out." (Continued on page 2)

"I'm not sure where I learned this technique. I've been doing it for so many years and it almost always has good results for me. I have a friend that always uses Clonex (a rooting hormone) on hers and bags them, but that doesn't seem to work well for me."

Here is Linda's "Red Lion" in 2019! When asked if it was going to show again this year Linda replied, "Maybe, if it grows and blooms well enough! Our local show is in April. I'm going to the Gesneriad Society convention in July. Our state show is in September. It will have several chances to go to show. I plan on going to Houston for the National Convention too, but I think "Red Lion" might be too big to haul that far. It is about 18 inches right now and still growing." Well done!
