Imitating Mother Nature

Getting the Light Just Right

Mother Nature provided the original African violets in nature with a deep forest canopy to shelter the delicate plant from the intense rays of the sun at the equator. Those rays are less intense at more distant latitudes but direct light, especially in summer months may still be too intense for violets. Some light fixtures may also be too bright. And some violets seem to prefer gentler light.

How do you know if the light is too bright? Watch for short petioles (leaf stems), unusually compact growth, and foliage which is bleaching to a lighter green.

What can a grower do when light is too bright? Here are some relatively inexpensive solutions:

- Sheer curtains on windows are time-tested, effective and attractive
- Bubble-wrap secured to glass will filter the light and also insulate from cold or heat
- Parchment paper secured to window glass or around light fixtures will filter the light gently and won't deteriorate if it gets damp.
